

CROSSOVER YOUTH CENTRE IN LISS, NEEDS YOU!

Have you seen those pieces that say, "Do you remember when." and then go on to say things like you would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as you were back when the streetlights came on.

No one was able to reach you all day and you were OK. You would spend hours building your go-karts out of scraps and then ride down the hill, only to find out you forgot the brakes. After running into the bushes a few times, you learned to solve the problem. You did not have PlayStations, Nintendos, X-Boxes, 99 channels on TV, no DVDs, no mobile phones, no text messaging, no laptops, no Internet, no Facebook, ...YOU HAD FRIENDS and you went outside and found them! You fell out of trees, got cuts and grazes and there were no lawsuits from these accidents. 'Those were the days,' I hear you say!

However, times have changed for better or worse, and our young people have different stresses, strains, challenges and limitations on them. Crossover is a drop- in centre for young people in Liss, which seeks to help, encourage, motivate and befriend young people, who may not experience the same freedoms of childhood that we might have had.

So, can you help? Crossover needs volunteers. You do not have to be an expert on young people, but in some ways we all are, because we were all once young.

Can you serve in the café and make snacks? Are you arty, and could you offer yourself and some craft making ideas? Are you a champion pool, table tennis or computer game player? Do you want to see if a young person can beat you at the game? Are you friendly and easy to talk to or a good listener? Could you offer a couple of hours to help keep the centre clean and tidy or help with fundraising? If so, Crossover needs you!

And what will you get from it? Well, you will work with a great team of people and make new friends. Believe it or not, you will probably learn a lot about yourself and be pleasantly surprised by how wonderful young people are. It will be a rewarding experience where you can give back to your local community and in particular to the next generation of young adults. What more could you ask for?
